



MOUNTAIN RANCH COMMUNITY SETS THE BAR HIGH FOR CONSERVATION PLANNING

The Land Trust Alliance has recognized Canyon Ridge, a new ranch community in the mountains of Northern New Mexico, as an exemplary project for combining conservation with limited real estate development. Rare Earth New Mexico Principals Tim Newell and Mike Plant will share the story of Canyon Ridge at the National Land Conservation Conference, slated to take place in Pittsburgh, September 18-21. As stewards of this 5,700 acre ranch community, Plant, Newell and partner Kent Smith have collaborated from the project's infancy with a team of environmental planning specialists, led by Steve Boyle of BioLogic, to set aside more than 4,000 acres in conservation. The result? 81 families will share in the legacy of ownership of this magnificent parcel of land - preserved for generations to come.

"It is not about what we are doing at Canyon Ridge," says Kent Smith. "It is about what we aren't doing. We are 100% committed to preserving this land in perpetuity."
